The Pick cross-references in this chapter are from the Egypt chapter of the *SCWPM*; Krause does not treat United Arab Republic as a separate entity.

On 1 February 1958, President Gamal Abdel Nasser of Egypt and President Shukri al-Kuwatli of Syria signed a treaty creating the United Arab Republic with Cairo as its captial and Nasser as president. Iraq and Yemen both expressed interest in joining in an even larger Pan-Arab state, but the UAR never grew beyond the Egyptian and Syrian provinces represented by two stars on the UAR flag.

Series/Prefixes

The earliest and latest verified series/prefixes are shown in the following listings. Be advised that not all series/prefixes within the range have been verified; it's possible that the printer skipped some letters/numbers for unknown reasons. Also, there may be cross-overs (i.e. the same series/prefix appears on different types or varieties), therefore the series/prefixes shouldn't be used as the sole determining factor in identifying a note.

Central Bank of the United Arab Republic

Prior to the establishment of the Central Bank of Egypt in 1960, the intention was to create an institution called the Central Bank of the United Arab Republic (CBR), but this never materialized.

1958 Proofs

Based upon the handwriting in the margins, these proofs were submitted for approval on 13•2•59. Although never issued by the United Arab Republic, these general designs were repurposed by Egypt on notes dated 1961 (Egypt B301 - B307).

Egyptian/UAR Government

While these notes were issued by the United Arab Republic government, the institution remained largely under Egyptian control with continuity in the authorities.

In the interest of simplicity, the UAR issues are numbered in sequence with the preceding and subsequent Egyptian issues, and reference the same signature numbers.

Each signature appears twice; once in English, and once in Arabic.

Law 50/1940 (1958) Issues

These notes are like the preceding issues from the constituent country of Egypt, but the panels at top center front/back read "United Arab Republic" in Arabic. Below the panel is a footnote in Arabic stating the banknote was issued by the "Province of Egypt." However, the country name changeover isn't complete because EGYPTIAN / CURRENCY NOTE still appears in English at lower center back, below which is the printer imprint SURVEY OF EGYPT.

Law 50/1940 (1961) Issues

In 1961, Syria seceded from the United Arab Republic (Egypt would continue to be known as the UAR until 2 September 1971), resulting in further changes to the inscriptions on the banknotes. For this series, the phrase "Province of Egypt" in Arabic was removed from the front of the banknote, and the back now reads UNITED ARAB REPUBLIC / CURRENCY NOTE in English at lower center back, below which is the new printer imprint SURVEY DEPT.

Looking Forward

On 28 September 1961, Syrian officers staged a coup d'etat and declared independence. Reluctant to give up on the idea of a larger Pan-Arab union, it wasn't until 2 September 1971 that the United Arab Republic officially changed its name to The Arab Republic of Egypt. For later issues, see Egypt.
